After retiring as Archbishop of Canterbury in 1974, Archbishop Michael Ramsey spent several terms at Nashotah House where he was much beloved by students. A first-floor flat was designated "Lambeth West" for his personal use. His stained-glass window also includes a miniature image of the Bishop and his wife Joan placed in the chapel by the class of 1976 who were among his first students at Nashotah.

The Right Reverend Charles C. Grafton **2nd Bishop of Fond du Lac**

As bishop, Grafton significantly increased the number of parishes and priests in his diocese, improved diocesan finances, started schools and was a strong supporter of Nashotah House. Not only did he obtain a legacy for Nashotah House of \$350,000 and other raised gifts that provided support and supplies for seminarians, he is ultimately responsible for the Nashotah House Francis Donaldson Library as a result of his inspiring influence.
