MASTER OF MINISTRY (MM)

Theological Preparation

The Master of Ministry (MM) is a first professional degree in ministerial leadership, focusing on biblical knowledge, theology, church history, homiletics, liturgy, and pastoral ministry, designed to train those serving the church in a variety of lay and ordained ministries. Students range from ordained clergy strengthening their theological foundations for ministry to lay persons informing their faith and/or discerning a call to ministry. The MM degree is normally completed in just over two years in the hybrid-distance format. The MM degree offers courses in areas of competency required for ordination in the Episcopal Church, the Anglican Church in North America, and other continuing Anglican bodies, although the educational requirements for ordained ministry may vary at the discretion of bishops and ordaining bodies.

- Hybrid-Distance format
- In the Hybrid-Distance program, students attend four one-week sessions on campus each year to take up residence on our historic lakeside campus for lectures, twice-daily worship, meals eaten in community, and evenings for study and/or fellowship
